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1. Competition update

1.1. Allocation of Preliminary Phase pools

The Drawing of Lots for the CEV Beach Volley European Cup Preliminary Phase took place in the CEV Office in Luxembourg on Friday September 4, following the principles and criteria communicated in the event [Official Communication No4](#).

As per these principles the allocation of the participating Clubs across the Preliminary Phase pools, based on the results of the Drawing of Lots, reads as follows

Men:

Pool A (Pool 1 West): Ile de Re, France 26-27 September 2026

The Practical Information document for each Preliminary Phase tournament will follow shortly, to allow travelling clubs to plan their participation accordingly.

Travel, board and lodging expenses as to be borne by the participants, as per the CEV BV [European Cup Official Communication No1](#). All teams should plan for a full day of competition on both Saturday and Sunday, irrespective of their pool allocation.

2. Competition Parameters

2.1. Preliminary Inquiry and schedule

The Preliminary Inquiry across all pools will take place the Friday evening before the start of the competition from 19:00 (local time). All delegations member (maximum up to 6 athletes and accredited coaches / delegation members) must be present at the Preliminary Inquiry, presenting their playing uniforms and ID documentation.

2.2. Competition format Preliminary Phase

The competition format will be a club vs club double header format in a round robin system played over two (2) competition days. No Golden Set will be played in case of a tie after completion of the club vs club double header.

For Pools of 4 Clubs a single round robin system will be applied, while for pools of 3 Clubs a double round robin system will be applied (each Club facing the other 2 Clubs in the pool twice).

Wins and losses per match will be counted as follows:

- 2 points for the winning club of a match
- 1 point for the losing club of a match
- 0 points for the club that forfeits a match

In case of a tie in match points at the end of the pool, the tie will be broken according to the principles laid down in the [CEV Beach Volleyball Guidelines Section 1 – Article 3.4](#) (Tie in a pool play competition method), with each club will be considered as one team for the respective calculation.

2.3. Seeding within the pool

The seeding of the participating clubs within the pool will be according to the result of the drawing of lots annexed to this document

2.4. Order of the club vs club double header

The proposed order of the round robin format is the following:

Pools of four (4) National Federations:

- Match 1: club seeded #2 vs club seeded #3
- Match 2: club seeded #1 vs club seeded #4
- Match 3: club seeded #2 vs club seeded #4
- Match 4: club seeded #1 vs club seeded #3
- Match 5: club seeded #3 vs club seeded #4
- Match 6: club seeded #1 vs club seeded #2

Pools of three (3) National Federations (repeated twice, see Art. 2.2):

- Match 1: club seeded #2 vs club seeded #3
- Match 2: club seeded #1 vs club seeded #3
- Match 3: club seeded #1 vs club seeded #2

Due to promotional reasons, the Hosting Club/NF may request an alternative order of the club vs club double header. Such request is subject to prior approval by CEV.

2.5. Rights of participation

All formalities detailed in the competition [Official Communication No2](#) needs to be submitted for the athletes participating in the Preliminary Phase latest 7 days prior to the respective pool.

2.6. Athlete's Uniforms & Accessories

As already indicated in the competition [Official Communication No1](#), each participating Club is responsible for providing all delegations members with uniforms, including the athletes' tops/jerseys. Extensive marketing exploitation of the uniforms with exposure of up to 4 sponsors/supporters remains with the Club. Please refer to the layouts the competition [Official Communication No1](#).

In addition, each participating Beach Volley Club retains the right of displaying a Title Sponsor in the official Club's name used for the entire competition.

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1. Organisers Preliminary Phase

In line with the competition's Official Communication No3 – Article 3.2 the CEV is herein providing an update over the number and dates of the competition Preliminary Phase tournaments.

Following the application process and timeline for the candidates wishing to host the CEV Beach Volley European Cup Preliminary Phase pools as outlined in the respective Candidature Application Guidelines, the confirmed organisers of the Preliminary Phase tournaments are the following (in chronological order):

2. Competition update

2.1. Preliminary Phase Drawing of lots

In line with the competition's Official Communication No1 – Article 2.1 the registered clubs will be drawn to one of these tournaments applying geographical and seeding criteria.

More specifically:

- all registered clubs will be divided and drawn into two geographical regions, West and East as following: Tournaments in France, Italy and Sweden belong to the West region, while tournaments in Poland, Greece and Hungary belong to the East Region.
- the top clubs of each region (considering the BV European Cup country ranking) will be seeded as pool leaders, while the same principle will be applied for each of the following drawn pots.
- in case multiple NFs share the same country ranking the one with the best result in the 2025 edition will be seeded higher; in case of same result in 2025 alphabetical order will be applied in accordance with the CEV standards for international volleyball competitions
- Organising Clubs cannot be positioned in the same pool. If that occurs, the club drawn in an already assigned pool will be moved to the next available spot
- 2nd or 3rd registered Clubs from the same country will be drawn after seeding all first registered clubs and cannot be positioned in the same pool as other clubs of this country. If that occurs, the club(s) will be moved to the next available spot.

2.2. Qualification to the Final

Seven clubs will be qualifying from the Preliminary Phase to the Final of the CEV Beach Volley European Cup, which will take place in Alanya, Türkiye from the 5th to the 8th of November as follows:

- Winners of the six pools will qualify directly.
- The seventh qualified team will be the best second placed club through all 6 pools, according to the CEV Beach Volley European Cup Country Ranking. Should two or more clubs share the same country ranking a draw will be performed in the CEV Office to determine the 7th spot during a live public streaming.

In case spots to the Final become available due to last minute withdrawal(s), this(se) spot(s) will be allocated to the respective Preliminary Phase pool runner-up.

Should a Club wishes to withdraw from the CEV Beach Volley European Cup, financial sanctions will be applied in accordance with the CEV Beach Volleyball Competition Regulations.

3. Competition update

3.1. Clubs' registration

All Beach Volleyball Clubs who gain the right and wish to participate in the CEV Beach Volley European Cup 2026, need to be registered by the respective National Federation through the relevant [Registration Application form](#), to be sent to beachclubs@cev.eu following the respective deadlines:

- Qualification via National Championships: within two weeks of the completion of the National competition for clubs. In case this is played in August, the latest deadline is August 17th 2026.
- Qualification via Zonal Championships: the form must be submitted by July 16th 2026

The registration of the roster representing each Club is due by August 27th 2026, through the [Registration of Athletes form](#), to be uploaded on the respective folder of the CEV Cloud.

To participate in the competition all athletes must be listed in this form within this deadline, change of players or late registrations will not be permitted for the duration of the competition (both Preliminary Phase and Final).

All necessary documents for the participation of an athlete are listed in Article 3.2 of this document and will have to be uploaded on the CEV Cloud latest 7 days prior to their participation in the competition (both Preliminary Phase and Final).

CEV will provide a personalised and individual link to all National Federations and Clubs after receiving their Registration Application form.

3.2. **Player's Rights of participation**

- Be duly registered in the Volleyball Information System (VIS) and meet the FIVB/CEV eligibility criteria
- Provide the [Declaration of Support and Commitment](#), in case registered in the VIS by a different National Federation to the one the Club is affiliated to. Please note that incomplete documents will not be accepted. Take the time to complete this form, as multiple parties need to sign.
- Upload the [Players' Health Certificate](#) on their VIS Profile
- Have completed both the FIVB "Play Clean" anti-doping course, the FIVB e-learning course on the Prevention of Competition Manipulation and Safeguarding.

Only athletes not suspended by CEV and/or FIVB are allowed to participate in the competition.

Each athlete may represent only one (1) Club per European Cup season.

3.3. **Preliminary Phase**

The CEV Beach Volley European Cup Preliminary Phase will be played in a tournament format with all qualified and registered Clubs as per the registration deadline, conditions and documentation provided in Section 1 of the [Official Communication No.1](#).

The Candidature Application guidelines for the Preliminary Phase tournaments are available on the CEV website here: [2026 | CEV](#).

Each tournament will be played in a Club vs Club double header format and will consist of a Round Robin pool play where each Club plays each other in 2 matches. Each match is allocating two (2) points to the winning and one (1) point to the losing Club team. Zero (0) points are allocated in case a team forfeits a match.

An update over the number of Preliminary Phase tournaments and dates/locations will be shared following the clubs registration and the candidature application deadlines through a subsequent Official Communication.

3.4. **Final 2026**

The CEV Beach Volley European Cup Final 2026 will be played with eight (8) Clubs per gender.

The breakdown of the eight (8) Clubs is as follows:

- Organiser Spot – Registered Club from Türkiye
- Seven (7) Clubs qualifying from the Preliminary Phase as detailed in Section 1 of the CEV Beach Volley European Cup Official Communication No 1.

The Final will be played in a Club vs Club double header format and will consist of two phases:

- A pool play phase in Round Robin format where each Club plays each other in 2 matches, with each match allocating 2 points to the winning and 1 point to the losing Club.

- A single elimination final phase where each Club plays each other in 2 matches.

In case of a tie after two matches, the 3rd and deciding match will be played as a Golden Set to 15 points right after the 2 previous matches. For the Golden Set, each Club must field a pair made up of a new combination of athletes who have not played together in either of the previous two matches. This pair can include players from the earlier matches or athletes who have not yet competed in the double header. No substitution will be allowed in the Golden Set.

3.5. **Competition Parameters**

In both the Preliminary Phase and the Final each Beach Volleyball Club participates with 2 teams and a delegation of minimum 4 and maximum 6 athletes, plus mandatory 1 coach/head of delegation.

Each Club is entitled to 1 substitution per match (an athlete may leave the game and re-enter the court only once, and only to the same athlete, out of the 2 potential substitutes registered in the scoresheet).

An athlete who has participated as a substitute in the 1st match of the double header cannot participate as a substitute in the 2nd match. No substitution is allowed in case a Club is participating in the competition with only four athletes.

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CEV Beach Volley European Cup 2026

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Introduction

Since its introduction in 2023 the **CEV Beach Volley European Cup** aims at incorporating Beach Volleyball Clubs in the CEV Beach Volleyball ecosystem, in close collaboration with National Federations and other stakeholders.

Following a successful 2025 season with a record number of participating Clubs and events, the CEV is now launching the 2026 edition.

As per the principle applied in the 2025 edition the CEV Beach Volley European Cup 2026 is planned for the last quarter of 2026, following completion of the qualification process detailed below.

Men's and Women's competitions will run separately from each other. The 2026 edition of the Beach Volley European Cup will consist of 2 phases: a Preliminary Phase (pools and events to be confirmed at a later stage) and a Final tournament, featuring 8 clubs per gender.

1. Qualification Process

1.1. Zonal Event qualification pathway

Each Zonal Association is entitled to host one qualifying event towards the Beach Volley European Cup. The Zonal Association Club Championship winner obtains the right to compete in the CEV Beach Volley European Cup (preliminary phase).

The homologation of the qualifying Zonal Event needs to happen by **April 30th 2026**, by submitting the Zonal Beach Volleyball Clubs Competition Homologation form. This form contains the relevant organising terms and conditions to host such competition. This event must be concluded by **15th of July 2026 at latest**.

To participate in the Zonal Beach Volleyball Clubs Competition, a club must participate also in their respective National Clubs Championships.

All qualified Clubs having the right and wish to participate in the Beach Volley European Cup need to be registered by the respective National Federation **by July 16th** through the relevant [Registration Application form](#). The registration of the athletes due to represent the Clubs is due by **August 27th, 2026 at latest**.

1.2. National Championship qualification pathway

As per the previous editions, each National Federation is entitled to host one or multiple events to qualify Beach Volleyball Clubs to the CEV Beach Volley European Cup.

National Federations with an already existing or planned National Clubs competition shall define and communicate to the CEV the respective information (number of events, process of clubs registration, number of participating clubs etc.) by **April 30th, 2026**, through the respective National Clubs competition Homologation Form.

The National Beach Volleyball Club competition needs to be concluded **by August 16th, 2026, at the latest**.

The **winners** of the National Clubs competition obtain the right to compete in the CEV Beach Volley European Cup 2026.

In addition, **a 2nd spot is allocated to the 2nd ranked Clubs from the top 4 National Federations** in the 2026 CEV Beach Volleyball NF Ranking that can be found here: [Rankings | CEV](#).

If a Club wins both the Zonal Association Club Championship and its respective National Club competition, the qualification from the Zonal Association Championship will be prioritised. The vacant spot from the National Clubs competition will be granted to the next eligible Club.

All qualified Clubs having the right and wish to participate in the Beach Volley European Cup need to be registered by the respective National Federation **within two weeks from the end of the respective National Championship 2026** through the relevant [Registration Application form](#). Should the championship happen in August, the latest deadline to sign up the club will be 17th of August 2026. The registration of the athletes due to represent the Clubs is due **by August 27th, 2026 at latest**.

1.3. European Cup Final organiser's spot

The organiser of the Final will be granted a spot to the Final and may be a National Federation or a Club and will be confirmed through the Candidature Application process initiated by the CEV.

In case the organiser is the National Federation, the winning Club of the respective National Federation will earn this spot provided that the National Clubs Championship is duly homologated.

In case the organiser is a Club, this will automatically earn the right to participate in the European Cup Final, provided that:

- ✓ The NF supports the Candidature Application to host the event
- ✓ The Club participates in their respective homologated National Clubs competition

Should the same Club win also the National Championship, the right to participate to the European Cup (Preliminary Phase) will be allocated to the next best ranked Club in the National competition.

1.4. 2025 European Cup Winner spot

If the winning Clubs of the 2025 CEV Beach Volley European Cup edition do not reach qualification through the above mentioned pathways, they will still obtain the right to register for the 2026 CEV Beach Volley European Cup (Preliminary Phase).

2. Competition

2.1. Dates and format

The 2026 edition of the Beach Volley European Cup will consist of 2 phases: a Preliminary Phase and a Final tournament, featuring 8 clubs per gender.

The spots will be allocated the spots to the Final will be allocated through a preliminary phase that will involve all registered Clubs, apart from the organiser of the Final. The preliminary phase will be completed the following weekends:

- o 26th – 27th of September 2026
- o 3rd – 4th of October 2026

The competition is played in a Club vs Club format where each Beach Volleyball Club participates with 2 teams and a delegation of minimum 4 and maximum 6 athletes, minimum 1 coach and 1 head of delegation. The coach cannot be a player registered for the competition and it is a mandatory requirement for this competition.

The preliminary phase will be organised in pools, considering the number of homologated National events and registered clubs, seeding and geographical criteria and will be detailed in subsequent Official Communications.

Each participating National Federation/Club has the right to apply for the organisation of the Preliminary Phase tournaments. A document detailing the organising conditions will be shared to all NFs/Clubs concerned and will follow the principles applied in the Final in regard to the

CEV support and participating Clubs' obligations, yet lower organisational conditions for the organising NF/Beach Volleyball Club will be required. The document will be shared with all stakeholders in January 2026.

In case of insufficient number of organisers for the Preliminary Phase, these will be drawn amongst the registered Beach Volleyball Clubs.

2.2. **CEV Beach Volley European Cup NF Ranking**

The CEV Beach Volley Cup NF ranking reflects the results of each past edition and the current standing of participating National Federations.

Ranking points are allocated to all clubs participating in the CEV Beach Volley European Cup, including those participating in the preliminary phase, and are retained over a period of three years with a percentage of 60% for the points resulting from the most recent edition of the competition, 30% for those from the event held a year earlier and 10% for the remaining edition included in this three-year period.

The ranking follows the below scale and will be used for the seeding of Clubs representing their respective NF. The seeding of additional Clubs from the same NF will follow the seeding of all NF champions as per the principle applied in the CEV Volleyball Clubs competitions.

** The ranking points for those clubs not qualifying to the Final are based on the number of total registrations and the competition format of the preliminary phase tournaments.*

2.3. Prize money

A Prize Money of 17,500 EUR per gender will be allocated in the Beach Volley European Cup Final, as per the following breakdown:

No prize Money is allocated for the preliminary phase tournaments.

2.4. Athletes' Uniforms & Accessories

Each participating Club is responsible for providing all delegations members with uniforms, including the athletes' tops/jerseys. Extensive marketing exploitation of the uniforms with exposure of up to 4 sponsors/supporters remains with the Club and as per the annexed layouts.

In addition, each participating Beach Volley Club retains the right of displaying a Title Sponsor in the official Club's name used for the entire competition.

2.5. Transportation, Board and Lodging

- Preliminary Phase: all participating Clubs are responsible for their travel, board and lodging expenses.
- Final: all participating Clubs are responsible for their international travel and for any further expenses such as visa or airport taxes. Board, lodging and local transportation will be arranged by the organiser. Participating clubs will pay a contribution fee as detailed in the Financial Regulations section of this document.

3. Financial Regulations

3.1. Participation Fee

To participate in the CEV Beach Volley European Cup, the respective Club shall pay a once off participation fee of 200,- EUR to the CEV through their respective National Federation.

3.2. License Fee

For each athlete participating in the CEV Beach Volley European Cup, each Club shall pay a once off license fee of 50,- EUR, upon receipt of the respective CEV invoice and through the respective National Federation, as defined in the CEV Beach Volleyball Competitions Regulations.

3.1. Contribution Fee – Beach Volley European Cup FINAL

Each participating club shall pay a contribution fee to the organiser to support expenses associated with their accommodation and local transportation. Such fee is 130, - EUR (one hundred thirty Euros) for each delegation member per night for the period from the official day of arrival until the day after of their elimination from the competition. More specifically the fee

includes transportation from the official venue of arrival to the official hotel for the athletes and up to two (2) duly accredited team officials (coach, head of delegation, physiotherapist) on the official days of arrival and departure and full board hotel accommodation in twin rooms from the official day of arrival (starting with dinner) until the official day of departure (breakfast included).

4. Further Information

All necessary information about the competition will be circulated to National Federations by using the Official Communications and the relevant Practical Info documents.

Additional information concerning the competition and the registered teams will be published on the CEV Beach Volley European Cup competition section of the CEV website.
