ORGANISING TERMS & CONDITIONS**



EVENT CONDITIONS	
Event name	"Zonal Association" Continental Tour-Zonal Event 2024
Number of events	Five (5) events per gender per Zonal Association – Max. 1 event per gender per National Federation.
Application forms	Fully completed <a href="#">FIVB Zonal Tour Homologation</a> and <a href="#">CEV BV-A2 Event Approval Form</a> including all requested enclosures signed by both the respective Zonal Association and the hosting National Federation
Application deadline	<b>Min. 35 days before the event – <u>Late applications will not be considered</u></b>
Competition Dates	Proposed by the respective Zonal Association and approved by the CEV
Duration	<b>Min. 2 days Main Draw</b> with a maximum of 3 matches per team per day
Prize Money	Minimum of 1'500.- EUR up to maximum of 4'000.- EUR per gender per event
Participating teams	<b>Min. 12 teams Main Draw with a min. participation of 3 National Federations affiliated to the respective Zonal Association.</b> Wild Cards may be allocated by CEV to non-member NFs, in case the minimum number of teams is not achieved and with a limit of up to 25% of the entire number of minimum teams
Registration Procedure / Regulations & Forms	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Mandatory usage of CEV/FIVB online registration system and the CEV/FIVB forms and courses including the CEV BV-01 Players Commitment &amp; the FIVB BVB-10 Health Certificate forms</li> <li>- CEV License fee per athlete (once per season)</li> <li><b><u>Registration Deadline:</u> – 21 days from the first Preliminary Inquiry</b></li> <li><b><u>Confirmed Teams lists:</u> – 15 days from the first Preliminary Inquiry</b></li> <li>No changes in competition parameters (format, quotas etc.) following the issuing of the Confirmed Teams lists</li> <li>An entry/participation fee may be imposed according to the Competition Regulations of the respective Zonal Association</li> <li>Competition Regulations in regard of quotas, position of Host Country teams, competition format are according to the respective Zonal Association Competition Regulations if any.</li> <li>For all other competition parameters the CEV Beach Volleyball Competition Regulations and the FIVB Official Beach Volleyball Rules shall apply.</li> </ul>
Venue Facilities	In line with FIVB Beach Official Beach Volleyball Rules and the CEV Regulatory framework
Court Equipment	In line with FIVB Beach Official Volleyball Rules and the CEV Court Equipment Checklist. The CEV will be providing MIKASA balls to all Zonal Associations that have to be used for all CEV approved Continental Tour Zonal Events
ORGANISERS OBLIGATIONS	
Zonal Association	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Enforce the FIVB Official Beach Volleyball Rules.</li> <li>✓ Assign by end of March a contact person to collaborate for all competition related issues with CEV throughout the season.</li> <li>✓ Provide the CEV with the Zonal Association Competition Regulations in force by the end of April or latest along the application for the 1<sup>st</sup> event of the season.</li> <li>✓ Appoint one Supervisor per event latest 30 days prior to the tournament.</li> </ul>

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	<p>The Supervisor shall appear in the CEV/FIVB Technical Supervisors list. The Supervisor is responsible to coordinate and apply the tournament and competition parameters and report during and after the event as per the instructions of CEV and the Zonal Association concerned.</p>
National Federation/ Organiser	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Provide the Practical Info template to the CEV and affiliated National Federation the <b>latest 30 days prior to competition</b></li> <li>✓ Propose the list of event referees and Referee Manager through BV-LR form to CEV for approval, with a minimum of 3 referees per court out of whom 1 International BV referee, /Candidate, <b>latest 20 days prior to the tournament</b>. <u>All referees should appear in the referees list in the VIS with a proven record of officiating in the last 2 seasons.</u></li> </ul> <p>The proposed Referee Manager should be either a CEV/FIVB Referee Delegate or an FIVB International Beach Volleyball Referee and <u>cannot act as a Referee during competition</u>. National Federation may propose for CEV approval a person not featuring in the above lists, presenting proof of his/her prior involvement and experience in Beach Volleyball referee matters. He/she needs to be fluent in speaking, reading and writing English and will be responsible to coordinate refereeing issues and report to the Zonal Association/CEV following respective guidelines.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Assign a VIS manager latest 15 days prior to the tournament to run the competition software with a good understanding of Beach Volleyball competitions and prior VIS experience.</li> <li>✓ Forward a competition preview and a daily report at the end of each competition day to the CEV, accompanied with a minimum of 5 photos.</li> </ul>
Post Event Report	<p><b>5 days after the event at the latest</b>, the organiser shall send to <a href="mailto:beach@cev.eu">beach@cev.eu</a> a post event report including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>– the respective CEV Post Event Report form or the Zonal Association Post Event Report form, if existing, duly completed and signed</li> <li>– photos of the competition courts plus venue supporting facilities and areas</li> <li>– minimum 20 high resolution pictures for each competition day</li> <li>– samples of all printed materials (posters, leaflets....)</li> <li>– samples of produced uniforms (if provided)</li> </ul>
Media rights and production standards	<p>The CEV is granting to the Organiser the non-exclusive domestic media rights in relation to this event. For the avoidance of doubt, all other media rights are exclusively retained by the CEV.</p> <p>In case the Organiser wishes to exploit such media rights, they shall contact the CEV: <a href="mailto:tv@cev.eu">tv@cev.eu</a> latest 15 days prior to the start of the competition to agree on minimum production standards. and match signal delivery</p>
Ranking Points	Subject to FIVB confirmation and in case all organising terms and conditions fulfilled

Venue branding & Marketing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>– Up to 4 CEV/CEV Partners / CEV Campaign panels in each court, including 1 event title as per the provided layout</li> <li>– One CEV flag in a predominant position in the venue/tribune.</li> <li>– Uniforms and all image and identity materials needs to be submitted for CEV approval prior to production.</li> </ul>
Promotional Productions	Use of the CEV marks in promotional activities (posters, banners, leaflets, backdrops) following the CEV guidelines and respective approval prior to production
