FUND TYPES



TYPE 1: Project-Based Applications

- Eligibility: NFs, clubs, and individuals with NF's endorsement
- Project designed by the applicants and CEV to evaluate and make final decisions on support period and amount.
- Periodic evaluation required.



- Eligibility: Depends on open application (individuals, clubs, NFs)
 - Project designed by CEV.
- Examples: Material support, Athletes'
 Dual Career, Educational
 opportunities, Female coaches
 empowerment, etc.

TYPE 2: CEV-LED INITIATIVES



PROJECT DURATION, MONITORING, EVALUATION

1

DURATION

1 year, renewable upon evaluation. Maximum duration is 3 years.

2

MONITORING

Self-assessment based on adapted criteria, conducted bi-annually.

3

EVALUATION

CEV actively involved. Bi-annual in first year, annual thereafter.

PROJECT ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA



1 QUALITY OF PROJECT DESIGN & FEASIBILITY

Clear and realistic objectives, budget, timeline

Technical & operational capacity

2 STRATEGIC FIT & VOLLEYBALL FOCUS

- Alignment with <u>CEV core values</u>
- Volleyball as the core activity

- 3 TRANSPARENCY & MONITORING
 - Transparent financial plans
 - Measurable outcomes & monitoring plan
 - Potential for co-funding

4 COMMUNITY & IMPACT

- Community engagement and impact
- Safe sport and inclusion policies
- Lasting benefits beyond the funding period

EVALUATION FRAMEWORK

- Minimum score for consideration: 70/100 points.
- A minimum half the points must be obtained in every criterion.
- Projects will be evaluated in 5 key criteria, each weighted by its importance and complexity:

TRANSPARENCY & MONITORING	 Team's ability to track, report and evaluate progress and compliance Auditable accounts and visible spending decisions Measurement of the project impact and monitoring responsibilities Clear KPIs 	25 points
COMMUNITY & IMPACT	 Community engagement and impact Safe sport and inclusion policies Potential to create lasting benefits beyond the funding period, helping to build a lasting legacy 	20 points



PROJECT ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA: CHECKLIST

QUALITY OF PROJECT DESIGN & FEASIBILITY

- Has the project established budget plan (1-3 years) for funding needs?
- Is the implementation plan realistic (timeline, objectives, resources and team capacity)?
- What risks are associated with the project, and what strategies are in place to mitigate those risks?
- Does the project use innovative digital platforms or technologies to improve delivery, reach, or impact?

STRATEGIC FIT & VOLLEYBALL FOCUS

- Do the vision, mission, and goals of the project align with CEV's core values?
- Is Volleyball the main activity of the project, used as the main platform through which broader goals are pursued (e.g. promoting healthy lifestyle, education, inclusion)?



PROJECT ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA: CHECKLIST

3 TRANSPARENCY & MONITORING

- Are there auditable accounts and visible spending decisions?
- Is there a sustainability plan in place to ensure that the benefits of the project continue after the support ends (project legacy)?

4 COMMUNITY & IMPACT

- What will be the impact on the community, and how will it be measured?
- Is the project inclusive?
- Are there policies against discrimination, mistreatment, and harassment within the project?

WHAT IS CEV-LEAD INITIATIVE?

Through CEV-Lead initiatives, CEV will support aspiring individuals who are endorsed by their respective National Federations, in areas that align with CEV's strategic priorities. This may include initiatives such as, but not limited to:

- Support for grassroots and grassroots coaches;
- Material Support;
- Guidance for athletes exploring dual-career pathways;
- Educational opportunities for National Federation staff.

The CEV-Lead Initiatives may be announced at any point during the year and will be communicated to National Federations via the CEV website, emails, and social media channels. These initiatives are designed to empower key individuals who play a vital role in the sustainable development of Volleyball across Europe.

EXAMPLE 1: FEMALE COACHES EMPOWERMENT



12 BENEFICIARIES

Two female coaches (at all levels) from each zonal association form a cohort for one year.



DEVELOPMENT OPPORTUNITIES

CEV Coaches Convention participation, networking events, and mentorship from high-level coaches.



PROGRAMME OUTLINE

Covers conventions, networking, mentorship, and contingency.





ELIGIBILITY

- Volleyball athletes with a demonstrated record of participation in CEV competitions
- Preparing for second career
- Good English proficiency


EVALUATION

DECISION-MAKING BODIES

CEV OFFICE COMMITTEE

Composition: 2-3 CEV office staff members.

Roles:

- Receive applications
- Evaluate and make recommendations to the Decision-Making Panel
- Monitor ongoing projects and provide feedback
- Provide administrative support

DECISION MAKING PANEL

Composition: CEV President, 3 Board Members, 1 CEV Office Committee member

Roles:

- Review the recommendations submitted by the CEV Office Committee
- Make final decisions on the recipients and the amount of funding
- Determine whether to renew funding for the following year (if applicable)
