

CEV Champions League Volley Volleyball Cup Challenge Cup 2027

Official Communication No. 1

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1. INTRODUCTION

This Official Communication No. 1 (Registration) supports all National Federations interested in registering teams the 2027 CEV Club Competitions.

It contains important information and explanations about registration, regulations, and other items to ensure a smooth running of the competitions.

You will find a useful timeline / to-do-list in the [Organisation Guidelines - Chapter 1](#) available on the CEV website. Please read it carefully.

The CEV Office is available to help, should you have any questions, or need any assistance during this process.

2. 2027 REGISTRATION PROCEDURE

Registration is done via the CEV database by completing the 01 form (one per gender), no later than:

Monday, 15 June 2026 at 12:00 CEST.

Once you close the 01 form, the data is recorded and cannot be changed anymore. The CEV will set the form as 'Accepted' as soon as it is checked. When the signed and stamped originals sent by mail are received, the CEV will set the form as 'Confirmed'.

3. ALLOCATION OF SLOTS

The allocation of slots per National Federation reflects the [CEV European Cups 2027](#) Ranking List.

Since Russian and Belarusian teams are not eligible to register for participation in the CEV European Cups 2027, further to a decision made by the CEV Board of Administration, the vacant positions in the 4th Round of the CEV Champions League Volley will be allocated according to a strategic approach designed by the CEV to enhance the quality of the competition. Therefore, such vacancies will be regarded as wild card slots.

According to the CEV Volleyball Competitions Regulations Article 31.1 §1, The CEV only registers a maximum number of Clubs per gender and per National Federation, as follows:

- a) 5 in all Club competitions
- b) 3 in the CEV Champions League Volley

The club getting a wild card is not considered in the calculation of the maximum number of participants for each and all club competitions.

Notwithstanding the above, a National Federation granted a wild card for the CEV Champions League Volley shall not be entitled to an additional qualification slot via a CEV Zonal Association Cup or CEV Zonal Association Championship, should the total number of participating teams from that Federation exceed six (6) across all CEV club competitions.

Any CEV Zonal Association Cup shall be finalised:

- Women: by 11 October 2026
- Men: by 25 October 2026

The CEV Zonal Associations are kindly requested to inform CEV no later than by **Friday, 03 July 2026 at 23:59 CEST** to confirm the teams participating in their Zonal Cup – if any such competition is organised. The event shall feature a minimum of four teams per gender representing four different countries.

4. CL 4th Round – WILD CARD APPLICATION

Further to the decision of the CEV Board of Administration, wild cards may be granted for participation in the 4th Round of the CEV Champions League Volley.

The CEV is committed to ensuring that this process is run and governed with a strategic, balanced, and forward-looking mindset. The evaluation process considers both sporting merit and the overall contribution a club can make to the sporting, commercial and promotional development of the competition.

The CEV hereby invites interested clubs to submit their applications for a wild card to enter the competition.

Each application must include comprehensive information addressing the following evaluation criteria:

1. Sporting Merit & Competitiveness

- Recent national and international results
- Domestic league and/or national cup standing
- Performance in previous CEV competitions (if applicable)
- Ambition and competitiveness for the upcoming season
- Team roster

2. Venue & Infrastructure

- Venue name, city, and capacity
- Compliance with CEV requirements (e.g., flooring, lighting)
- VIP, media, and team facilities
- Historical attendance and fan engagement figures in CEV and national competitions

3. Organisational Capacity & Event Organisation

- Description of the club's organisational structure
- Previous experience in hosting international or major domestic matches
- Operational readiness to meet CEV match organisation standards
- Estimated fan attendance for the CEV Champions League Volley matches
- Sports presentation strategy

4. Commercial & Marketing Potential

- Key sponsors and commercial partners
- Fan base data (attendance, social media following, community engagement)
- Marketing and promotional plans for the competition
- Proposed strategies for enhancing visibility of the club and the event
- Opportunities to create joint activities between the club's commercial partners and the CEV.

 *Note: While commercial proposals are not a formal requirement, they may be taken into account in the evaluation process to maximise the competition's value and visibility and partner exposure.*

5. Media Plan

- Club's digital communication strategy (website, livestream, social media)
- Content creation capabilities (video, interviews, match coverage)
- Ability to support CEV's digital and broadcast strategy

6. Strategic Value for European Volleyball

- Impact of participation on volleyball growth in the region or country
- Market development potential and media reach
- Youth programmes, school engagement, or grassroots outreach
- Long-term commitment to developing the sport

7. Commitment to CEV Values

- Respecting CEV Regulatory Framework
- Upholding Fair Play, Integrity, and Inclusiveness
- Promotion of gender equality and diversity
- Sustainability and environmental responsibility initiatives

The CEV Office remains at your disposal for any assistance in submitting the application and reserves the right to request additional information or clarifications during the evaluation process.

Applications must be submitted via email to clubs@cev.eu with the respective National Federation in copy no later than **Monday, 15 June 2026 at 12:00 CEST.**

Please note that the final decision regarding the allocation of wild cards rests solely with the CEV Board of Administration.

5. CEV REGULATORY FRAMEWORK

During your participation in a CEV competition, you will have to use and comply with the CEV Regulatory Framework, mainly with the CEV Volleyball Competitions Regulations, Guidelines, and the Official Communications. You will also have to fill in CEV forms. These forms are available in your area in the CEV database.

8. KNOCK OUT COMPETITION METHOD – UPDATE

Further to the approval of the CEV Board of Administration on 03 March 2026, please be informed that in a "Home and Away" match, the winner shall be the Participant that wins both matches. In the event that each Participant wins one match, the fixture, shall be considered tied, and the Golden Set procedure shall be applied to determine the eventual winner.

14. CHALLENGE REFEREES APPOINTMENT – UPDATE

According to the latest version of the CEV Volleyball Competitions Regulations (adopted by the CEV BoA in March 2026), a specific **Challenge Referee** will be appointed by the European Refereeing Commission for the following competitions stages:

CEV Champions League Volley 2027:

➔ From Playoffs onwards

CEV Volleyball Cup 2027:

➔ From Playoffs onwards

CEV Volleyball Challenge Cup 2027:

➔ For final matches H-A

The Challenge Referees are part of the category “Match Officials” so their nomination **and cost coverage** are subject to the CEV Volleyball Competitions Regulations like for all other appointed CEV Officials (Supervisor, Referees, Referee Coaches).

15. USE OF CHALLENGE SYSTEM – UPDATE

CEV Champions League Volley 2027:

Please be reminded that the use of the Challenge System is mandatory in all rounds of the CEV Champions League Volley 2027, including the Early Rounds.

CEV Volleyball Cup 2027:

The use of the Challenge System is mandatory starting from the Playoffs of the CEV Volleyball Cup.

CEV Volleyball Challenge Cup 2027:

The use of the Challenge System is mandatory starting from the ¼ Finals of the CEV Volleyball Challenge Cup.

16. USE OF LED SYSTEM & GIANT SCREEN

CEV Champions League Volley 2027:

The LED system and giant screen are mandatory for **all rounds** of the CEV Champions League Volley 2027.

The clubs **must** submit the “LED system application form” (including the specifications of the Giant screen) to the CEV for approval no later than 1 September 2026.

CEV Volleyball Cup 2027:

The static banner system is allowed up to the ¼ Finals. The LED system is mandatory starting from the ½ finals.

The clubs shall submit the “LED system application form” to the CEV for approval no later than 25 September 2026.

CEV Volleyball Challenge Cup 2027:

The static banner system is allowed up to the ¼ Finals. The LED system is mandatory starting from the ½ finals.

The clubs shall submit the “LED system application form” to the CEV for approval no later than 25 September 2026.

A combination of static banners and LED system is not permitted in any of the above competitions.

The LED system application form is available on the CEV Cloud (download area). The application form must be submitted as specified in the application document.

17. USE OF LED SYSTEM PLAYLIST

The LED system playlist is based on a 360 second loop which is split between CEV and the organising club. See the percentage under “Commercial rights”. Club sponsorships shall be sold only within the 60% visibility allocated to each club, hence only one LED playlist loop shall be submitted to CEV for approval.

18. COMMERCIAL RIGHTS

In accordance with the rights already granted to Clubs (Chapter 18 of the CEV Volleyball Competitions Regulations), the table hereafter shows the split of Advertising spaces on the Playing area between the CEV and the organising clubs.

***The static banner system is allowed up to the ¼ Finals for CEV Volleyball Cup 2027 and CEV Volleyball Challenge Cup 2027 only. From the ½ finals the use of LED system is mandatory.*

**** The LED system playlist (rundown) is based on a total of 360 seconds loop, rotating from the first whistle of the referee at the start of the match until the end of the match. The pre-match rundown is non-commercial.*

The official LED playlist will be made available on the CEV cloud.

Each organising club may submit one playlist for approval per match. Multiple playlists are not accepted.

Each organising club is granted a total of 215 seconds per 360 secs loop during one match for their sponsor visibility on the LED system. (20 slots of 10 secs, one slot of 15).

Note that a club sponsor may not have more than a total 20 seconds visibility in the 360 second loop.

 - Buy Now, Pay Later (BNPL) Services: (e.g., Klarna and similar providers)
 - Money Transfer and Remittance Services: (e.g., Ria, Western Union, and similar providers)

- o Payment Systems (all categories of payment systems, networks, and related technologies (e.g. Apple Pay, Google Pay, Samsung Pay, PayPal, Satispay, Astropay))
- 4. BETTING AND GAMBLING SERVICES*
- 5. BODY AND HEALTHCARE PRODUCTS
- 6. COURIER SERVICES AND LOGISTICS
- 7. CRYPTO AND DIGITAL ASSETS
 - o Cryptocurrency exchanges (e.g. Binance, Bybit, Coinbase...)
 - o Digital wallets and custodians (e.g. Ledger, Metamask...)
 - o Blockchain providers (e.g. Polygon, Solana...)
 - o Token issuers (e.g. companies issuing utility, governance or fan tokens)
 - o NFT platform and marketplace (e.g. OpenSea, Rarible...)

- 8. CONSUMER ELECTRONICS (e.g. mobile phones, tv, tablet, telco providers)
- 9. SPORTSWEAR (e.g. Adidas, Nike, Mizuno, Puma, Macron,...)
- 10. SPORT EQUIPMENT ON THE COURT – Volleyballs and sports flooring (e.g. Mikasa, Gerflor,...)

For the avoidance of doubt, although the Betting and Gambling services sector and/or category is reserved for the CEV, the Organiser may exploit, based on prior agreement of the CEV and in and in full compliance with the national laws, the category for the “National lottery”, provided that their sports betting operations are in no way presented under the same brand as their national lottery operations.

N.B.: The above-mentioned reserved product categories will not be released by CEV. Hence, no sponsors listed above may be contracted by the participating teams for advertising on any space in the frame of the competition. Exceptions may be granted on a case-by-case basis, except for N°4, 9 and 10.

Exception: Despite the above-mentioned restriction, each team will be allowed to have one sponsor logo per restricted category either on the official player jersey or on the shorts, except for sponsors belonging to the category of sports equipment (n°10 Sports equipment – volleyballs and flooring). **NO competitive sponsor is allowed on the jersey or shorts in those categories.**

CEV VOLLEYBALL CUP 2027 & CEV VOLLEYBALL CHALLENGE CUP 2027:

The following categories are reserved for the CEV and are referred to as “Exclusive Protected Product Categories”:

1. BETTING & GAMBLING SERVICES*
2. SPORT EQUIPMENT ON THE COURT – Volleyballs and sports flooring (e.g. Mikasa, Gerflor,...)
3. SPORTSWEAR (e.g. Adidas, Nike, Mizuno, Puma, Macron,...)

*For the avoidance of doubt, although the Betting and Gambling services sector and/or category is reserved for the CEV, the Organiser may exploit, based on prior agreement of the CEV and in and in full compliance with the national laws, the category for the “National lottery”, provided that their sports betting operations are in no way presented under the same brand as their national lottery operations.

N.B.: The above-mentioned reserved product categories will not be released by CEV. Hence, no sponsors listed above may be contracted by the participating teams for advertising on any space in the frame of the CEV CUP and CEV CHALLENGE CUP.

Exception: Despite the above-mentioned restriction, each team will be allowed to have one sponsor logo per restricted category either on the official player jersey or on the shorts, except for sponsors belonging to the category of sports equipment (n°2 Sports equipment – volleyballs and flooring). **NO competitive sponsor is allowed on the jersey or shorts in that category.**

19. BRANDING

For the upcoming season, all materials and branding layouts will be available in due time after registration in the download area of the CEV Cloud, and all clubs must implement them for the 2026/2027 season.

Further information on all graphics will be published in the next Official Communication.

20. MATCH TECHNOLOGY

Participating clubs in the CEV European Cups 2027 should use the following match technologies based on the specific competition and phase:

- e-Scoresheet;
- e-Scoresheet Tablet;
- Data Volley 4;
- Video Sharing;
- Video Challenge;
- Wireless Headset.

Data Collection

e-Scoresheet, e-Scoresheet Tablet, Data Volley 4 and Video Sharing are mandatory and provided by CEV's official technology partner Genius Sports. The applications download and user guidelines documentation link is the following:

The software should be operated by following the official CEV Volleyball Competitions Regulations and the Genius Sport software user guidelines documentation:

- e-Scoresheet is the only official software, operated by one (1) Scorer who officially records the match progress, results, participants, events, protests, and sanctions of such match. Statistics of each match are collected by designated match officials of the Organiser (or home team) for CEV purposes.
- The e-Scoresheet Tablet is the part of the e-Scoresheet software operated by a team bench and match referees to manage match line-ups, substitutions, timeouts, video challenges, and to follow player positions.
- Data Volley 4 is the only official software, operated by one (1) Statistician who officially records players' and team's statistics of each match. The statistics of each

match are collected by a designated Statistician of the Organiser for CEV purposes.

- Video Sharing is a software operated by a designated Statistician to upload and download match video recordings and statistics collected by Data Volley 4.

The necessary login credentials (including username and password) for the above software are available to the Organiser on [the CEV Database](#) before the start of the competition.

The Organiser must provide free-of-charge the following facilities and resources during the CEV Competition to operate the e-Scoresheet, e-Scoresheet Tablet, Data Volley 4 and Video Sharing in a professional manner:

- Hardware including laptops or tablets that meets the software minimum technical requirements:
 - [e-Scoresheet requirements.](#)
 - [e-Scoresheet Tablet requirements.](#)
 - [Data Volley 4 requirements.](#)
 - [Video Sharing requirements.](#)
- Download and installation of the latest version of the software.
- High-speed and stable internet connection for e-Scoresheet and Data Volley 4 via LAN cable with at least 10 Mb/s up and down speed and necessary power supply during the CEV Competition to ensure professional data collection and distribution to CEV and all CEV Commercial partners.
- Appointment of an experienced Scorer and Statistician during the CEV Competition to operate the software applications and collect data and statistics according to the respective regulations.
- Execute [e-Scoresheet](#) and [Data Volley 4](#) match tests in the Competition Hall one (1) day before the start of the match scheduled for a CEV competition.
- Using the credentials provided by the CEV and only on a match court, ensure delivery of the [e-Scoresheet](#) and Data Volley 4 live match statistics without internet connection interruptions or data collection mistakes.
- Finalize e-Scoresheet match on the court within 5 minutes after the end of a match and print Scoresheet according to the Official Volleyball rules and CEV Guidelines.

Prohibition of any illegal or non-authorized collection, archiving and distribution of match related data and statistics during all matches.

Betting Data Collection

In order to enhance the quality of CEV data collected for betting purposes, CEV implement a revised betting data collection approach in cooperation with its Official Data Partner, Sportradar.

To support the implementation of this enhanced data collection process, we kindly request the cooperation of all organisers as follows:

1. Personnel Access

Organiser must grant match access to authorised data collection personnel.

- Identification: The CEV Data Department will provide scout details to the Club Organising Director on a match-by-match basis.

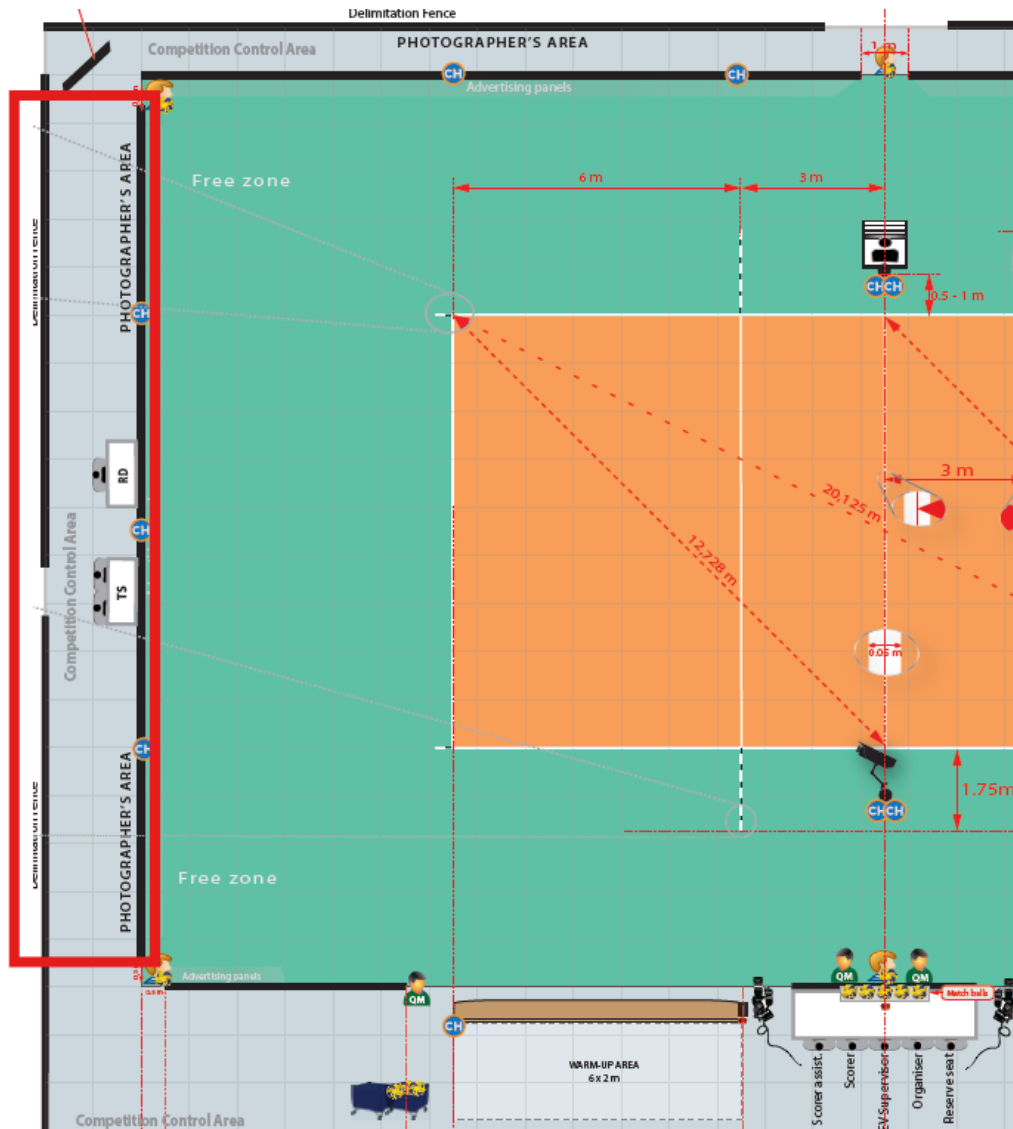


2. Dedicated Seating

- Location: One dedicated seat must be provided on the short side of the court within the technical zone.

- Alternative: If the technical zone is unavailable, provide a seat with a clear, unobstructed view of the court.
- Power: The workstation must have access to a reliable power supply.

Meaning of the short side of the court zone – highlighted in red (or the other side of the court depending on where the technical zone is):



3. Secure Connectivity

- **Wi-Fi:** A dedicated, password-protected Wi-Fi connection is mandatory.
- **Speed:** Minimum symmetric speed of **20 Mb/s** (both upload and download).
- **Privacy:** This network must be entirely separate from the public fan network.

Challenge system

- The requirement for video challenge is mandatory based on the specific competition and phase, with details provided in [CEV Volleyball Competitions Regulations – Art. 95.5](#)
- The system must be set and used according to the relevant [CEV Guidelines – 50. Challenge System](#)

Wireless Headset

- The requirement for wireless headsets systems for referees is mandatory based on the specific competition and phase, with details provided in [CEV Volleyball Competitions Regulations – Art. 95.4](#)
- The system must be set and used according to the relevant [CEV Guidelines – 51. Wireless Headset Communication System](#)

1. CEV Champions League Volley

Match Schedule

In relation to their home matches, it is the responsibility of each participating club to submit officially their match date & starting time (in local time) proposals to the CEV via the 07 form. It is the club's responsibility to ensure that all the submitted proposals are valid for review.

Once submitted by the club, the proposals are considered definitive and reviewed by the CEV and the CEV Sport Media Agency.

Similarly, the participating clubs sharing competition halls/venues shall coordinate between each other before submitting their proposals via the 07 form (such clubs might also request the support of their National Federation to help with the coordination).

The CEV and the CEV Sport Media Agency reserve the right to select any of the submitted proposals by the participating clubs and confirm the final match schedule (in accordance with art. 13.3. of the official CEV Volleyball Competitions Regulations).

Media Rights

On behalf of the CEV, the CEV Sport Media Agency Infront is managing and distributing the exclusive worldwide media rights with respect to the Men & Women CEV Champions League Volley. As a result, the participating clubs **do not hold** any media rights in their domestic territory.

In order to ensure a professional broadcast production, the participating clubs must provide upon request to CEV and its Sport Media Agency the following facilities and services on a free-of-charge basis:

- Camera platforms for one (1) or two (2) cameras centralised above the court and at the appropriate angle to produce a TV signal of international standard.
- A minimum number of commentary positions for each match to be located on the same side of the main camera and as close as possible to the field of play.
- Access to match data/statistics for the host broadcaster and the TV graphic operator.
- Adequate space in the TV and SNG compound for TV transmissions and production vans.
- One (1) fully furnished office for the CEV Sport Media Agency team on-site.
- Support to access the venue, TV compound and other broadcast areas.

2. CEV Volleyball Cup & CEV Volleyball Challenge Cup

Media Rights

With respect to the domestic matches only, the CEV is granting to the Participating Clubs the non-exclusive domestic media rights in the territory.

Host Broadcast Production

The participating clubs shall respect and fulfil the requirements stated in the CEV Volleyball Competitions Regulations and indicated below:

For the avoidance of doubt, the World Feed signal of each produced match must be delivered to the CEV and its Sport Media Agency free of charge via satellite according to the following standards:

- Uplink to an established European satellite
- Book the corresponding satellite space (including the end-to-end test synopsis)
- Provide an encrypted satellite feed (also called BISS code)

In order to ensure a professional broadcast production, the participating clubs must provide upon request to the CEV and its Sport Media Agency the following facilities and services on a free-of-charge basis:

- Camera platforms for one (1) or two (2) cameras centralised above the court and at the appropriate angle to produce a TV signal of international standard.
- A minimum number of commentary positions for each match to be located on the same side of the main camera and as close as possible to the field of play.
- Access to match data/statistics for the host broadcaster and the TV graphic operator.
- Adequate space in the TV and SNG compound for TV transmissions and production vans.
- One (1) fully furnished office for the CEV Sport Media Agency media and production team.
- Accommodation (full board) – up to 2 rooms for the CEV Sport Media Agency staff on-site provided that they request minimum 1 month before the start of each match.

Lastly, comprehensive TV production manuals/match running order and on-screen graphics package will also be distributed to each participating club and appointed host broadcasters.

22. DIGITAL & SOCIAL COVERAGE

The rising of mobile phone users and social media changed the way we look at the sport of Volleyball including our engagement to that unique sport. There are many different social media platforms like Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, TikTok, and YouTube. Fans worldwide can use these social media platforms conveniently in their daily lives. Social media has also become an important tool for promoting events, distributing content, attracting new readers, and creating more engagement to teams and athletes.

The participating clubs should use social media to promote the CEV Club competitions. You may find below industry standards as well as social media tips that can be used throughout the season:

- Go “behind the scenes.” Make fans who are not at the event feel like they are there (and want to attend next time) by showing the scene on social media accounts. (e.g. show what the players are doing in their off time, before the game, etc.).
- Quote players: people love sharing a great quote. Make sure you use quotation marks and attribute it to the speaker.
- Think quality not quantity.
- Interaction between fans and athletes: when you post an interesting fact about a player, tag the athlete.
- Cross-post to other media. Make posts by attaching photos and videos of the event.
- Interact with people at the event. Share newsworthy posts by fans and credible sports journalists.

Participating clubs are also expected to engage and support the CEV Digital & TV Department with the following actions:

- Promote the events via their own social media channels on a regular basis.
- Use the official competition hashtags whenever posting about it.
- Access and use CEV Social Media Graphics creator platform.
- Share on their social media behind-the-scene photos and video footage, showing the social side of players and staff, which can be re-tweeted or shared further on by the CEV.
- Provide the CEV with additional content to distribute on social media: the best promotion comes from the players themselves.
- Produce additional video material, such as mixed zone interviews in English, for publishing across social media channels.
- Engage with the CEV and other participating clubs on social media by liking, sharing, reposting, following, and retweeting content.

It is the responsibility of each participating club to provide quality pictures to the CEV based on the following requirements:

Athlete portrait shot & staff

A **portrait shot** of each registered athlete and key staff shall be provided as per the standard below:



Quality standards:

- Background: neutral – white only
- Eyes: facing the camera
- Expression: smiling
- Hands: behind the back
- Body position: straight to the camera with shoulder visible
- Match jersey: only from the current season (no training suit, national team jersey or polo shirts are allowed)
- Jersey number: to be visible on picture
- Dimension: 1800*2800 pixel and 300 DPI minimum
- Maximum weight: 6-8 MB

Team picture

Quality standards:

- Location: backdrop or on court.
- Background: neutral – white only
- Eyes: facing the camera
- Expression: smiling
- Body position: straight to the camera
- Match jersey: only from the current season (no training suit or polo shirts are allowed)
- Jersey number: to be visible on picture
- Team officials and head coach to wear smart dress code
- Fun team picture is also recommended (as a plus, to be delivered via CEV Cloud)
- Dimensions: at least 4000*2500 pixels and 300 DPI minimum
- Maximum weight: 12-15 MB

Each team registered will receive as usual 30 V200W-CEV or 15 V200W balls (depending on the competition) as material support from CEV. The balls will be sent by Mikasa to the

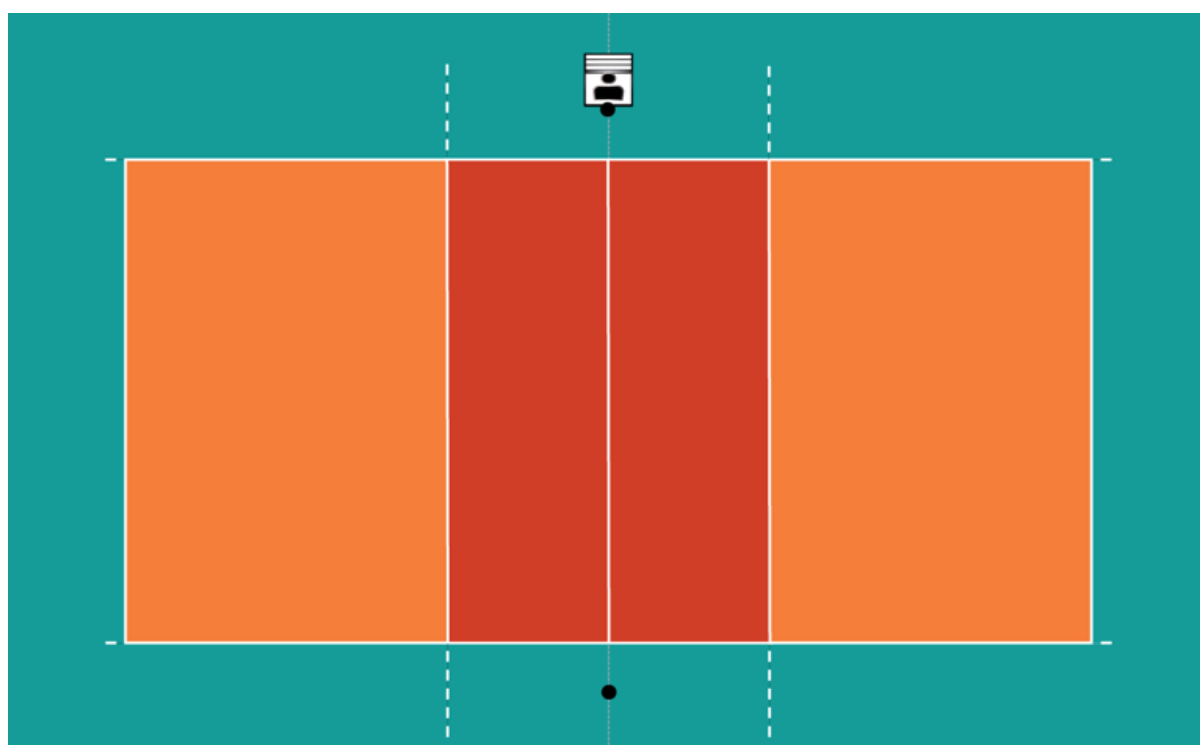
respective National Federation in September 2026, then the National Federations will be responsible for dispatching the balls to their clubs participating in the European Cups 2027.

Commercial LED Playlist information:

The commercial LED system playlist (rundown) is based on one loop of 360 seconds, rotating continuously from the first whistle of the referee at the start of the match until the end of the match. The pre-match rundown is non-commercial.

Each organising club is granted a total of 215 seconds per 360 secs loop during one match for their sponsor visibility on the LED system. (20 slots of 10 secs, one slot of 15).

Note that a club sponsor may have a maximum of 20 seconds visibility in the 360 second loop.

All advertising content of each club sponsor must appear simultaneously and uniformly across the entire LED board system. It is strictly prohibited to display different sponsors' advertisements at the same time on separate portions of the LED boards (e.g., one Sponsor on the left side of the court and another on the right side). The LED surfaces must operate as a single, coherent advertising platform.

Each organising club may submit one playlist for approval. Multiple playlists are not accepted.

The file of the official LED playlist, including the giant screen rundown, will be made available on the CEV Cloud – download area.

After compiling the final LED playlist, each club shall upload the file into its club folder on the CEV Cloud for approval no later than two weeks prior to the match.

Commercial Giant Screen Rundown information:

The giant screen visibility is split 60/40 between the club and CEV.

For commercial videos or sponsor messages shown between the 1st and 2nd set break, between the 2nd and 3rd set break, the visibility is allocated as follows per set break:

- Club sponsor timing: 110 seconds in total
- CEV timing: 70 seconds in total

2. CEV reserved product categories

As a reminder, the following categories are reserved for the CEV and are referred to as "Exclusive Protected Product Categories":

 - Money Transfer and Remittance Services: (e.g., Ria, Western Union, and similar providers)
 - Payment Systems (all categories of payment systems, networks, and related technologies e.g. Apple Pay, Google Pay, Samsung Pay, PayPal, Satispay, Astropay)

N.B.: The above-mentioned reserved product categories will not be released by CEV. Hence, no sponsors listed above may be contracted by the participating teams for advertising on any space in the frame of the competition.

Exception: Despite the above-mentioned restriction, each team will be allowed to have one sponsor logo per restricted category either on the official player jersey or on the shorts, except for sponsors belonging to the category of sports equipment (n°10 Sports equipment – volleyballs and flooring). **NO competitive sponsor is allowed on the jersey or shorts in that category.** See point 7 for the display of the uniform manufacturer.

For the avoidance of doubt, although the "Betting and Gambling services" sector and/or category is reserved for the CEV, the Organiser may exploit, based on prior agreement of the CEV and in full compliance with the national laws in force, the category for the "National lottery", provided that their sports betting operations are in no way presented under the same brand as their national lottery operations.

Furthermore, the CEV would like to inform you that unless otherwise specified, the respective club is the entity responsible for fulfilling the requirements of any National laws in force on publicity and advertising in their country as well as in the host country. In case of a clash with any National laws in force on publicity and advertising, the latter always prevails.

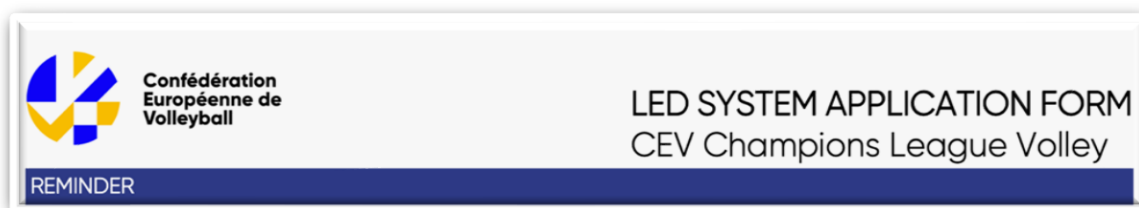

After approval of the S-form by CEV, teams shall check the approved form in case any sponsor/brand has been refused and make sure that it is not displayed on any advertising space.

After approval of the S-form, clubs may upload all their layouts into their CEV Cloud folder for approval. Please send an email to graphics@cev.eu to inform us about the uploaded files.

6. Application for LED system & Giant screen

As a reminder, using the LED system is mandatory for ALL rounds of the competition.



All teams shall download the LED system & giant screen application form from the CEV Cloud <https://cloud.cev.eu/url/ledapplform20> and submit it by email as instructed in the form and/or upload the completed and signed form to the appropriate club folder. In any case the club is obliged to notify the CEV by email to graphics@cev.eu.

The fully completed form with the technical specifications of the LED system as well as the requested specifications of the Giant screen must be sent electronically to CEV for approval:

→ by **Tuesday 11th September 2026, at the latest**

→ **Important:** CEV reserves the right to issue a financial sanction, in case the deadline is not respected, as per the CEV Volleyball Competitions Regulations.

After approval of the LED system application form, the CEV commercial partners will prepare their files and footage and make them available on the CEV Cloud, based on the specifications provided by each club.

Each club shall download those files for integration into their LED system and/or giant screen.

The official LED & giant screen playlist will be provided by CEV and made available in the Download area of the CEV Cloud.

7. Team Uniforms & Advertising

When ordering team uniforms, clubs must make sure they are produced according to the FIVB Official Volleyball Rules and the latest version of the CEV Volleyball Competitions Regulations.

1. SPONSOR APPROVAL:

All sponsors shall be approved by CEV through the S-form in the CEV database.

Please clearly indicate in the S-form which of the sponsors appear on the uniform.

The CEV reminds all participating clubs that they are the entity responsible for fulfilling the requirements of any National laws in force on publicity and advertising in their country as well as in the host country for away matches. In case of a clash with any National laws in force on publicity and advertising, the latter always prevail.

2. NON-APPROVED ADVERTISING

When taking part in the CEV Champions League Volley, a team member may not carry any advertising material other than the name/brand of the sponsors which have been registered by his team in the S-form and which have been approved.

For the sake of clarity, permanent and temporary tattoos may not display any advertising and shall be covered when in a competition.

3. TEAM UNIFORM APPROVAL PROCEDURE:

Any approval of team uniforms shall only be done after all sponsors are uploaded and approved in the S-form.

After approval of the sponsors through the S-form, teams are required to upload the layout in colour of their two sets of uniforms, shirts and shorts, with a front side and back side view into their club folder created on the CEV Cloud.

The CEV must be notified of the upload by sending a short email to graphics@cev.eu.

N.B.: The uniform may be pre-approved separately in case the production of the latter is launched before the activation of the S-form in the [CEV database](#), however, the club is fully responsible for the fact that all sponsors will later be listed and approved in the S-form.

Please refer also to the information under "Exception" on page 4.

4. MANUFACTURER LOGO

The logo of the manufacturer is authorised on the team uniform, including jersey, shirt, shorts, jacket and socks, so long as it does not exceed 30 cm² or 6 cm x 5 cm on each item.

As per the CEV Volleyball Competitions regulations Chapter 5 – Art. 34.4, any manufacturer's logo displayed on accessories must not exceed 6 cm².

5. COMPETITION LOGO BADGE:

The CEV Champions League Volley 2027 logo must be on the team jersey as from the first match, namely on the right sleeve for jerseys with sleeves or on the upper-right chest for jerseys without sleeves (see layout hereafter).

Teams shall download the new competition logo from the CEV Cloud and integrate the competition logo during the production of the jerseys.

Competition logo badge for team jerseys – Men's and Women's competition:



The dimensions of the competition logo badge are as follows: 70 x 79 mm (width x height). Each team is responsible for integrating the competition logo badge on the jersey.

Competition logo badge for Men's or Women's Champions League winners:

All winners from previous Champions League editions (men or women) have the right to use the competition logo badge with stars (examples from previous editions below), which indicate how many times the respective team has won the CEV Champions League Volley. The layouts can be downloaded from the CEV Cloud.

8. Uniform layout – Men's & Women's Competition



Positioning of the manufacturer's logo (20 cm² max) is free except for the restricted area on the back and inside or as a part of the player's number.

Shorts



Team accessories

1. Track suits or any other clothing worn by the Players in the Training hall or in the Competition hall must meet the Uniform requirements defined in the CEV Volleyball Competitions regulations.
2. Compression pads are approved but are required to be of the same colour design as the Uniform. No padding is allowed in compression forearm guards, as it provides advantages to the Players' performances. Neutral colours, black or white are acceptable.
3. Teams using compression pads shall be uniform in colour / design for all Players.
4. Any manufacturer's logo displayed on accessories must not exceed 6 cm².
5. No accessories may contain any other advertising.



The CEV supervisor must check players' uniforms and accessories during the preliminary enquiry before each match.

Production is compulsory for:

- LED system playlist to be compiled and uploaded on the CEV Cloud for approval, after confirmation of the LED application form.

Any other promotional material with CEV identification markers not listed above shall be uploaded for approval.

Please note that we do not provide any ticket and brochure / official program layouts. However, all the relevant information and logos must be included in the design layout produced by the clubs, namely the CEV logo, competition title and logo, and any CEV Official partner's logo. The production of an official brochure / official program is not mandatory.

Branding material may differ for the men's and women's competition. In case there are two options, the right one must be chosen.

All graphics will be available on the CEV Cloud. All Organisers can review the basic Brand Guidelines, download and use the official competition logo and graphic assets in various formats, as needed.

CEV Cloud is an optimised file-sharing and storage solution. All clubs have direct access to all resources via a web service interface. The CEV Cloud allows users to drag and drop files.

No logins or passwords are needed.

Special links navigate you to the CEV Club Competitions storage with two main folders:

Download, which contains all necessary files/templates you need to use to produce any possible material <https://cloud.cev.eu/url/clubscompdown>

and

Upload, for all files/layouts to be uploaded by the clubs for approval. These will be checked and approved by CEV before production. The upload folder is structured by club name <https://cloud.cev.eu/url/clubscompupl>

Note:

After uploading any files, the Graphics Department graphics@cev.eu must be notified by a short e-mail. (All files to be approved must be uploaded to the Cloud. Any e-mail attachments will not be taken into consideration).

Note that the CEV Cloud doesn't inform us automatically of the uploading of new files. That's why it is important to notify us via a short e-mail (without any attachments).

It is strongly recommended to share the files well in advance of production so that possible adjustments and recommendations can be made, bearing in mind that a certain reaction time must be considered.

N.B.: All branding material and layouts will be made available by CEV on the Cloud middle September 2026.

Approval deadlines: All material to be sent for approval before September 28, 2026.

10. Court Layouts

According to the CEV Volleyball Competitions Regulations and Champions League Brand Guidelines, all clubs participating in the CEV Champions League Volley 2027 are requested to respect the court layout as per the conditions displayed hereafter.

All **floor stickers** must be produced with an identical approach and style. Identical style means, if possible, a similar background for floor stickers (recommended are transparent or darker backgrounds).

Floor stickers F3 (competition title) and F4 (Host city) are mandatory and must always be presented with a transparent background. The Host City must be promoted in writing (full name) and in white colour (no city logo).

In the men's edition, the F3 position will be marked with a sticker with a transparent background, displaying the XTB logo and the competition name 'CEV XTB Champions League 2027 Men'.



In the women's edition, the F3 position will be marked with a sticker with a transparent background, displaying the Competition logo and the competition name 'CEV Champions League 2027 Women'.

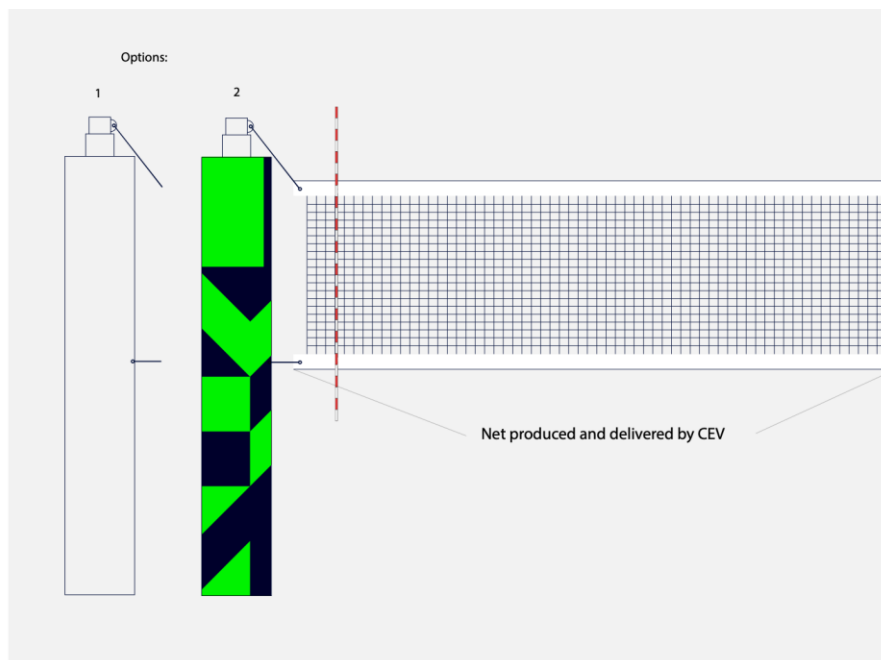

CEV cannot be held responsible for wrong shipments due to the provision of incorrect or obsolete addresses.

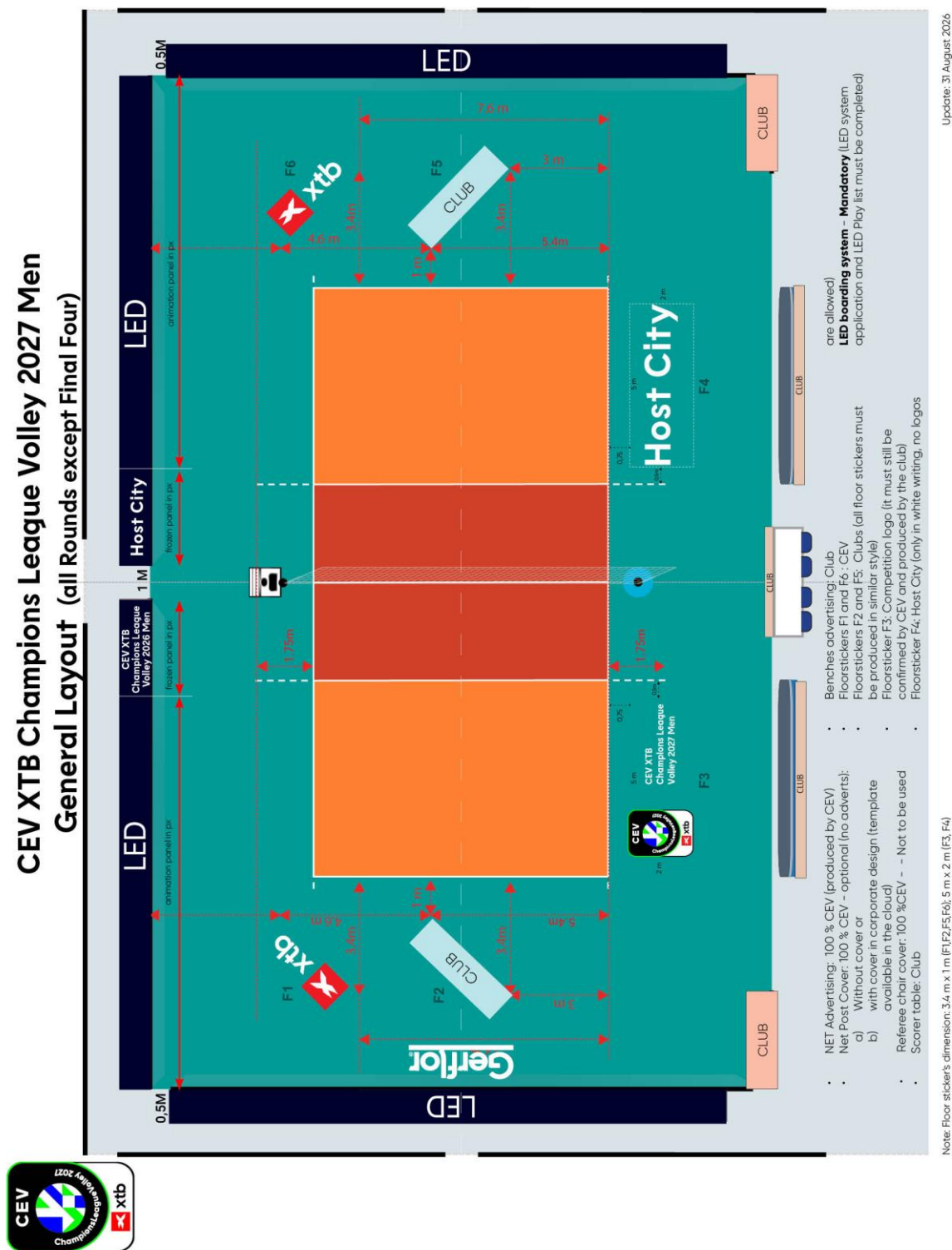

CEV XTB Champions League Volley 2027 Men – court layout



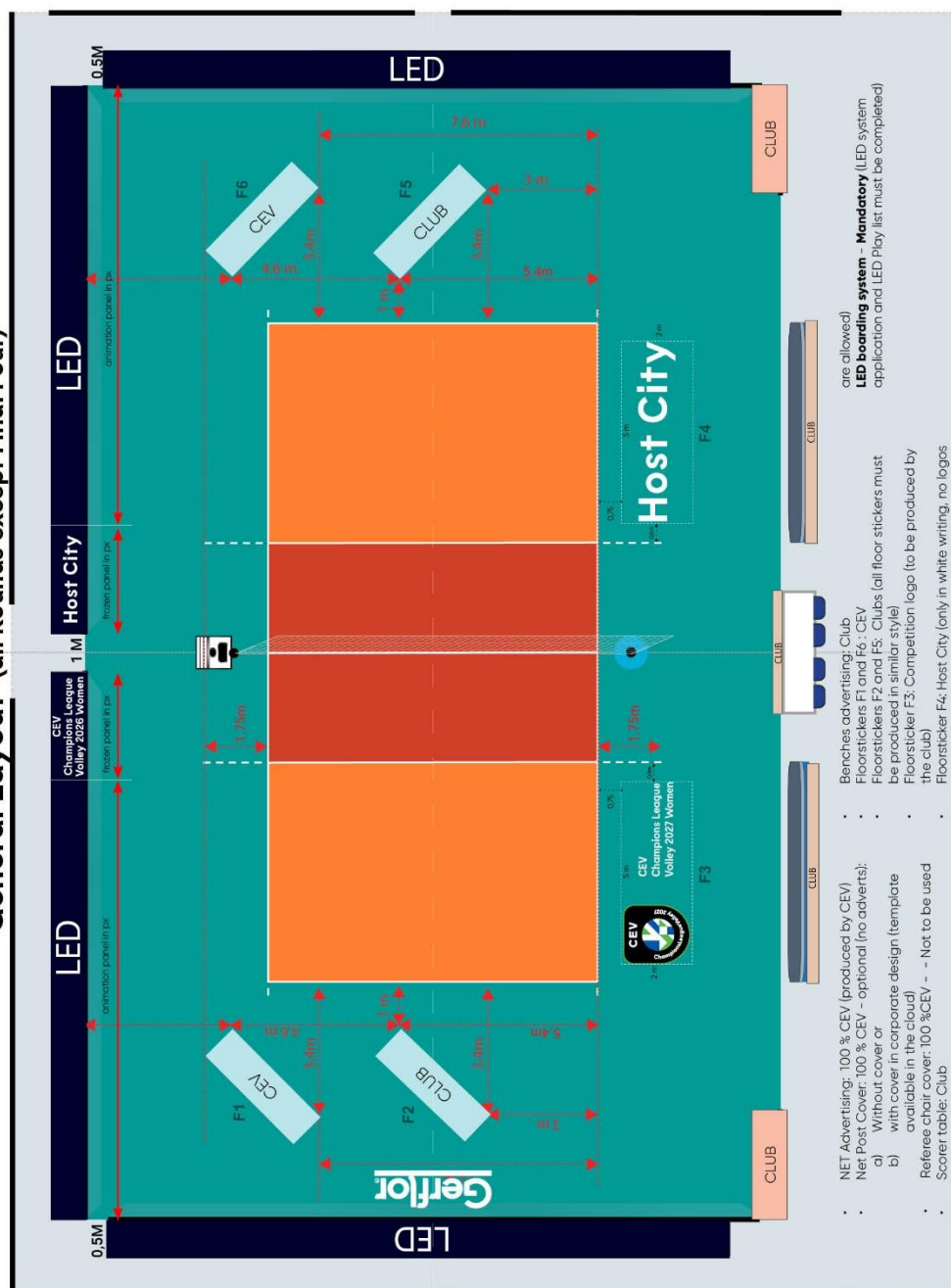

11. Media Activities

For the upcoming CEV Champions League Volley, the following media activities will be implemented at the Round 4 stage & onwards of the competition:

- Team/bus Arrival (recorded)
- Pre-match interviews in English (recorded)
- Locker rooms scenes (recorded)
- Coin-toss (recorded)
- Post-match/flash interviews in English (live)

The participating clubs are requested to support on-site the appointed host broadcaster to perform the above-mentioned activities in a professional and timely manner, including access to the team locker rooms, selection of players/coaches for the aforementioned activities and availability of the media officer to perform the different interviews in English.

12. Match Protocol & MVP Guidelines

We would like to inform that the official match protocol is available on the CEV website under the following link:

We would like also to remind that it is mandatory to award the MVP (Most Valuable Player) at the end of each match of the CEV Champions League Volley, the MVP of the match shall be awarded according to the above-mentioned match protocol and inserted accordingly in the e-Scoresheet. **The hosting club shall produce a trophy to award the MVP.** The award cannot be sponsored by a club sponsor.

These guidelines have been designed to notify all clubs participating in the CEV Champions League Volley in order to achieve a standardised look and feel of the MVP awarding - which is a mandatory requirement in all stages of the competition.

1. Award Production Guidelines

1.1. Design and Format

- **Form:** The MVP award may take the form of:
 - A small trophy or plaque
- **Size and Materials:**
 - Use durable materials such as acrylic or glass
 - Size: up to 25 cm in height
- **Design Elements:**
 - Must include:

- The competition logo (either men's or women's if available)
- The competition name and date:
For men: CEV XTB Champions League Volley 2027 Men. The words "Most Valuable Player" or "MVP"
For women: CEV Champions League Volley 2027 Women. The words "Most Valuable Player" or "MVP"
- Match information, club vs. club (for example: Olympiacos PIRAEUS vs. TRENTINO Itas)
- The award cannot be sponsored; no sponsor logos on it are permitted.



1.2. Consistency & approval:

- Maintain a standardized design throughout the season for uniformity.
- Upload the final design/layout into your club folder on the CEV Cloud and send an email to graphics@cev.eu, marketing@cev.eu to request approval.

2. MVP Award Presentation Protocol

2.1. Timing

- The MVP presentation takes place immediately after the game in front of the official backdrop.

2.2. Presenter

- The MVP is presented by a representative of choice by the club and the CEV Supervisor.

2.3. Presentation Procedure

- The MVP is awarded according to the Champions League Match protocol available on the CEV website (link: CEV Official Pre-Match Protocol & Post-Match Protocol CEV Champions League Volley)
- For Media: Capture a photo (e.g. for social media, club website, or club newsletter, etc.) and upload it to the respective match folder on the CEV Photo Gallery System.

13. International Transfers

Please kindly note that as of the 2026–2027 season, the administration of all International Transfers is centralised at the FIVB. Consequently, the FIVB is now the single point of contact for the processing and management of all international transfers.

14. FIVB Education Programmes

With reference to the CEV Volleyball Competitions Regulations Article 83 §4:

The Team manager shall present to the relevant CEV Official the following elements:

a. For each Team delegation member:

- i. The FIVB Anti-Doping education programme certificate,*
- ii. The FIVB Competition Manipulation Course certificate,*
- iii. The Safeguarding course*
- iv. The accreditation card.*

In this regard, the VIS platform shall be ready to produce the relevant certificates. For those officials that do not have access to the VIS platform, the respective Federation of Origin shall proceed with their registration so that they can login and complete the above-mentioned online courses. We also would like to remind all teams that the provision of such certificates is

mandatory to be eligible to take part in all CEV competitions, including the CEV Champions League Volley 2027.

Additionally, we would like to inform you that the FIVB Anti-Doping education programme and FIVB Competition Manipulation Course certificates can be uploaded in the CEV Database for each player in pdf format via the respective 04 form.

Regarding the players' eligibility for the European Cups 2027, as the current certificates are valid by the beginning of the competition, at this stage, it is not necessary to complete the courses again. Further information on this and regarding any additional requirements or obligations will follow in due course.

15. CEV Accreditation System

It is mandatory to use the CEV Accreditation System for all CEV Volleyball European Cups matches.

You can access the accreditation system via [this link](#) or via the Club Area of the [CEV Database](#).

The clubs that already used the Accreditation System in previous seasons may continue using their old login. The clubs that are accessing the Accreditation System for the first time shall confirm the account upon logging in.

In case a club does not remember their credentials, you may create a new one by clicking on "Forgot your password? Please click here to reset password"

Furthermore, there is a Badge Manager for the printing of the Badges for your home matches. Each club is responsible for printing the badges for their players and team officials for the entire season (excluding Final Four). In addition, badges can be printed on the dashboard by downloading each badge separately.

The guidelines on how to navigate through the software are available within the documents area in the accreditation system.

The layout of the accreditation badges must be strictly respected.

16. CEV Service Operator Management

Please be reminded that every club has unique login credentials to run e-Scoresheet, Data Volley 4 and Video Sharing applications included in the [CEV Database](#) Club Area. The login credentials shall be shared with the appointed match operators. Each club is responsible for changing the login credentials if and where needed.

Please follow the steps outlined here below on how to manage the CEV Service Operator Management tool:

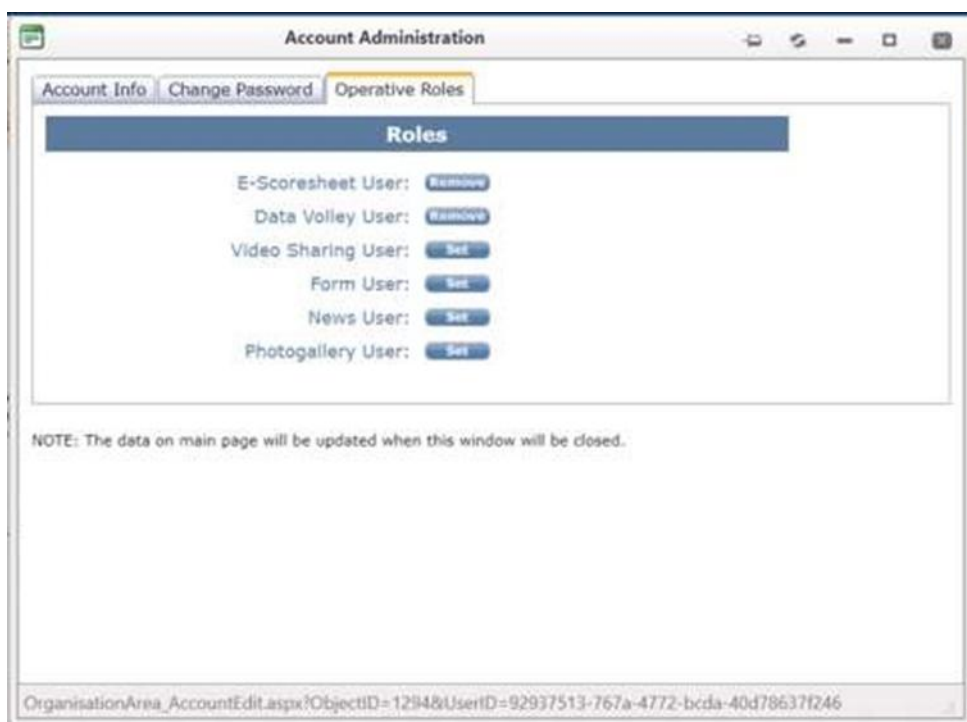

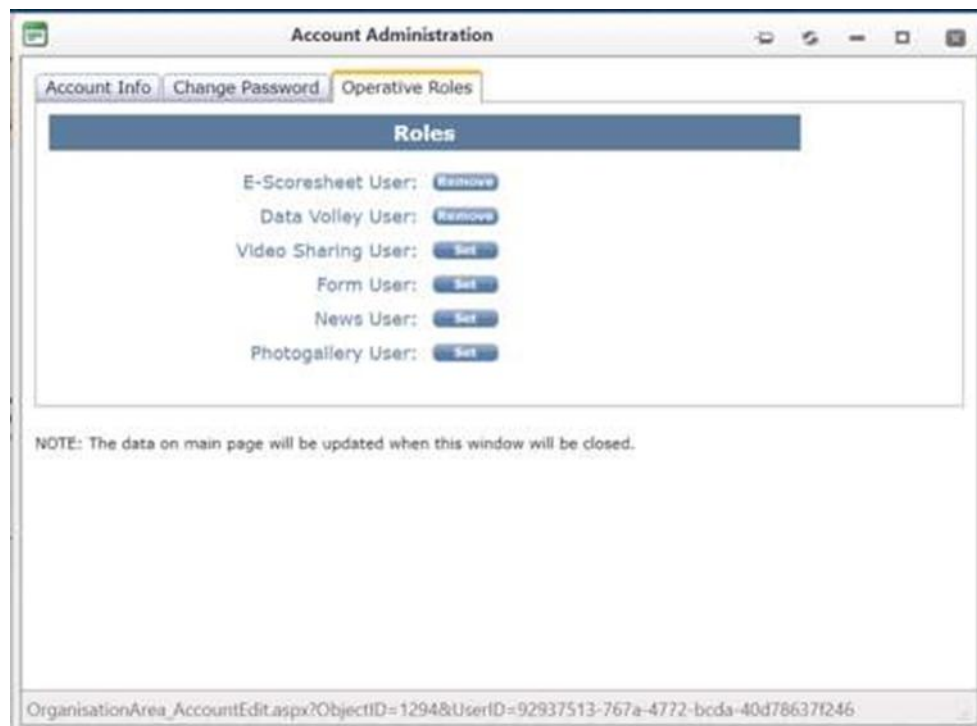

This is to ensure a professional and smooth data collection during the competition. If the tests are not performed, the Match Supervisor, Organising Director, and Application Managers will receive email notifications.
